Meet on Swanage Pier SZ 036 788 at 10:20 to catch 10:50 sailing on Waverley paddle steamer to Yarmouth arriving at 12:30. Fare £55 adults, £53 seniors. Eat lunch on board as there will not be any long breaks on the walk. At 12:50 take no 7 bus from Yarmouth Bus Station (stand B) to Alum Bay arriving at 13:15 and walk back along cliff top paths and promenades. No stiles, some steps and road walking.
